Ann: Yes, they are Teddy Bear and Chickadee.


What advice do you have for Cast A 2013?




Carolina: Running off and making out in the corner of a crumbling castle in Germany. It was a teenage dream come true.

Carolina: We won't because we always celebrate our wedding anniversary instead since it is a week later. 15 years coming






How/when did you know that he was "the one?"
