Setting up Lakeland was going to be a difficult task but the community greeted us with open arms and helped to make our preparation much easier than expected. To say that FSC is amazing is an understatement. The campus was named "Most Beautiful Campus" in 2012 by Princeton Review. Florida's weather allows FSC's students and Cast A 2013 to spend so much time outdoors, enjoying Lake Hollingsworth and admiring the Frank Lloyd Wright architecture. Aside from Florida Southern College, Lakeland is home to the MLB's Detriot Tiger's spring training stadium,

hundreds of swans, (originally sent to Lakeland by Queen Elizabeth), and most importantly, a caring and supportive community. Lakeland is a special place to call home.

My heart is filled with thankfulness and pride as I see Cast A 2013 walk through the doors each day...I know that all who worked to make staging happen are thrilled to see how successful it is.

Now, the students have officially arrived and Cast A 2013's semester has begun. What's the buzz in Lakeland now? It's all about the 100 international students from 21 different countries who have arrived and are living in over seventy host families!

How has Camp Up with People prepared you for your Up with People adventure?

Camp UWP was kind of a mini-experience of what I was going to experience at Up with People, and I feel that I received a sense of what it is all about be-

cause there were a lot of people from different countries at my camp. Even though Camp UWP was only for three weeks, we really became a family.

We performed a mini show—about half the length of an actual Up with People show— so I understood what it took to put on such a show. We practiced a lot and worked really hard.

I was also able to get used to being with people from different cultures. There was a girl at Camp UWP who would wake up at 5:00 in the morning to pray because it was part of her religion. There were also campers who did not speak any English so I was able to learn how to communicate with people who did not speak my language.

How did Camp Up with People affect your decision to travel?

It was my inspiration. If I had not gone to camp, I probably would not have traveled. It was a big commitment for me to put off college. I was very driven in school and felt as if I needed to go to college right away. However once I was at camp, met with my counselors, and heard about their travels, I decided I absolutely had to do it. I interviewed with a counselor at camp and found out from my college that I could defer my scholarships. I was to-

tally set. I had a goal and definitely had to do it.


Tell us about the relationships you gained from Camp UWP.



On December 14 and 15, 2012, an all-star group of Up with People alumni performed at an event honoring the 40th Anniversary of Apollo XVII. 
At the invitation of Captain Eugene Cernan, a longtime friend of Up with People and the commander of Apollo XVII, the group performed a few hits from the UWP archives, and closed the evening with the UWP classic song, Moon Rider, which was inspired by Captain Cernan's recollections as he viewed the earth from the moon.

The group of UWP alumni were honored to represent the program and the over 22,000 alumni at this spectacular event, which featured astronauts, engineers, and technicians from all of the Apollo and Gemini missions. Among those in attendance included Senator John Glenn, the first American to orbit Earth and oldest man to fly in space; James Lovell, Apollo XIII Commander; and Eugene Kranz, Gemini and Apollo Flight Director.
